





The 2024 WRC draw works in 2 parts. WRC 1 involves 6 teams (for a number of reasons) These 6 teams will fight it out qualify for the top 4 playoff and WRC Division 1 title at WRC 2. The bottom 2 teams after WRC 1 will drop down and be joined by Otago and hopefully one more team to play off for the 2nd Division title. If another team cannot enter WRC 2. It will be division 1 4 teams and division 2 3 teams This allows for development and extremely competitive wheelchair rugby to be played. The WRC 2 draw is TBC from WRC 1 standings.

WRC 1 draw- 2 Pools of 3 as per 2023 final results. Teams will play 2 Pool games on Saturday. The 1st and 2nd finishers in their pool will play crossover games v the1st and 2nd finishes in the other pool. 1st in Pool A v 2nd in Pool B and 1st in Pool b v 2nd in Pool A. 3rd in each pool will play each other with a spot to have a rematch if they would like. Final standing will determine the divisions at WRC 2.

SINGLET'S

Teams are required to bring 2 sets of singlets. This will minimise the chances of having singlet clashes. If an athlete wears a undershirt it must be the same colour as the major colour of the playing singlet otherwise a tec foul will occur. The head referee has said they will be harsh on a breach of this rule.

TOURNAMENT RULES

NZWR will allow you to wear an undershirt the same colour as your playing singlet or a black undershirt. Whilst the current international rules states the same colour as your singlet we must remember we are not internationals and the undershirt rule is turning people away.

All other Current IWRF Rules will apply to this tournament.

The current World Wheelchair Rugby Classification Manual will be adhered to except for the following:

- Athletes that are ineligible in accordance with the World Wheelchair Rugby Classification Rules shall be classified as; Paraplegics in their first year 3.5, Paraplegics after their first year 4.0. Able bodied athletes in their first year 4.0, Ablebodied athletes after their first year 4.5.
- Ineligible athletes, or athletes' with a "S" classification, will be moderated by the NZWR Committee appointed 'Social Grading Sub-Committee Representatives' throughout the event and any changes made will be at the discretion of the appointed representatives. Any decision will be final.
- Social (S) will be a classification that can be applied for, with a duration of one season of wheelchair rugby (social grading needs to be re-applied for on an annual basis). The aim of this grading is to encourage more athletes to continue playing wheelchair rugby, in doing so it should assist newer athletes and smaller regions to field competitive teams.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Athletes, Coaches and Officials associated with NZWR must be aware that they are often the focus of public attention. NZWR expects that all teams and associated personnel are aware that by registering, officiating and/or volunteering at the BASH you are agreeing to follow the NZWR Code of Conduct as below:

General

- Abide by both the rules and the spirit of all competitions.
- Conduct ourselves in a manner that won't discredit ourselves, NZWR and other teams.
- At all times when travelling to and from and whilst participating in a sporting or social event, dress in team uniform or other attire appropriate to the occasion.
- Obey and respect any direction given by an appointee of NZWR.
- Refrain from using offensive or abusive language.
- Refrain from being intoxicated and using any banned/illegal drugs or substances.

Players

- Whilst competing obey and respect any direction given by an official.
- Cooperate with your coach, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition.
- Never argue with an official. If we/I disagree, we/I will have my captain, coach or manager approach the official at the appropriate time.
- Never engage in physical or verbal abuse of officials or other players. Deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not acceptable or permitted.

Coaches/Managers/Officials

- Be reasonable in our demands.
- Teach players to follow the rules and set a good example.
- Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions.
- Condemn unsporting behaviour.
- Report incidents in writing to the NZWR within seven (7) days

Appeals Committee.

• An appeals committee will be present at WRC 1 and WRC 2. This will be determined by the availability, but all teams will be notified once these people are finalist



NZWR Anti-Doping Policy



In February 2024, NZWR approved an updated Anti-doping Policy.

Anti-doping

Anti-doping is founded on the intrinsic value of sport, often referred to as "the spirit of sport": the ethical pursuit of human excellence through the dedicated perfection of each athlete 's natural talents.

Anti-doping seeks to protect the health of athletes and to provide the opportunity for athletes to pursue human excellence without the Use of Prohibited Substances and Prohibited Methods.

Anti-doping programs seek to maintain the integrity of sport in terms of respect for rules, other competitors, fair competition, a level playing field, and the value of clean sport to the world.

The spirit of sport is the celebration of the human spirit, body and mind. It is the essence of the Paralympic Movement and is reflected in the values we find in and through sport, including:

- Ethics, fair play and honesty
- · Athletes' rights as set forth in the Code
- Excellence in performance
- · Character and Education


New Zealand Wheelchair Rugby commitment
